1. ABOUT THE COMPETITION

The HPRC Equestrian Challenge 2026 is an open equestrian competition organised by the Hyderabad Polo & Riding Club (HPRC), Gandipet, Moinabad, Ranga Reddy. The competition is open to all eligible riders from HPRC and affiliated clubs and units and aims to promote equestrian sport in the region while providing riders a competitive platform across all age categories and ability levels.

This edition introduces a 40 cm Show Jumping class — a dedicated entry-level height catering to beginner and younger competitors, making the competition accessible to a wider group of riders.

Course Walk: The course will be open for walk by the riders and their coaches 20 minutes before the start of the category.



Reporting for Each Class: The first two riders in the event / category must report to the Arena Steward at least 10 minutes before the scheduled start of that event. Any horse not reported in time can be eliminated unless the rider shows good cause for the delay.

4. PRIZE MONEY – SHOW JUMPING

Prize money will be awarded to Open category participants only in the 80 cm, 90 cm, 105 cm, Table C and Top Score (Open) Show Jumping classes provided there are a minimum of six riders in that category. Prize money is not applicable to the 40 cm and 60 cm classes.

Age-category classes (Children I, Children II, Junior) and Show Jumping 40 cm and 60 cm classes will receive medals and certificates only.

5. HORSES

- a. The health, wellbeing and fitness of all horses are paramount to HPRC. All units / clubs are mandated to ensure that the horses brought for the competition are fit.
- b. The Arena Steward will check the horse for its fitness to compete. If a horse is found to be unfit / lame / has open wounds, it will not be allowed to compete. Additionally, if the judges deem the horse to be unfit for the competition, they are empowered to disallow the horse from participating.
- c. Riders are responsible for the care and safety of their horses during the event.

6. ENTRIES AND FEES

- a. **Entry Form:** Please submit entries via the [HPRC Equestrian Challenge 2026 – Entry Form](#) providing all requested details and paying the relevant entry fees.
- b. **Entry Fees:**

- c. **Closing Date for Entries:** Entries will close at 18:00 hrs / 6 pm on Thursday, May 14, 2026 after which entries will be considered as Post-Entries.
- d. **Post-Entries:** Post entries will be accepted only until 18:00 hrs / 6 pm on Friday, May 15, 2026. No entries will be accepted thereafter. **We will not accept any Spot Entries for the competitive events.**
- e. **Age-specific Categories:** All entries for age-specific categories must be accompanied by birth certificates and the age of the rider must be clearly indicated on the entry form. Entries for this category will not be accepted without a copy of the rider's birth certificate.
- f. **Age Rule:** A rider must compete as the age that they are turning that calendar year irrespective of their month of birth.

- g. **Number of Entries:** A horse can participate only once in each category of an event / discipline.

On Days 1 and 2, a horse can have no more than three entries.

On Day 3, a horse is allowed only two entries per session (morning / evening) and is limited to three entries for the day.

7. OTHER INFORMATION

Withdrawal, Change, Transfer or Substitution of Entry:

- a. **Withdrawal:** The Entry fee of a horse entered for any event will not be refunded if the horse does not participate in the class.
- b. **Horse-Rider Combination:** Once an entry has been submitted for a horse-rider combination, any change to this will be considered as a new entry with the payment of the entry fees as stipulated.

Cancellation: The Organizing Committee reserves the right to cancel any class which has less than four entries, or for any other reason at their discretion. In that case, the entry fee will be refunded.

Whips/Spurs/Bits: As per EFI and relevant FEI rules.

Apparel: All riders must comply with EFI Dress Code Regulations during the event. Non-compliance may result in disqualification.

Appeals / Objection: A written appeal / objection may be lodged two hours before the commencement of any class and within half an hour of announcement of the results. A fee of ₹2,000/- must be deposited with the Show Secretary, along with the appeal / objection. The deposit will be refunded if the appeal / objection is upheld.

8. ELIMINATION / DISQUALIFICATION

Authority of the Ground Jury: During the event, the Ground Jury holds the authority to disqualify, eliminate, or evict a Person Responsible (PR) for violations of the FEI Code of Conduct. Such actions may be taken for:

- a. **Equine Welfare:** Any instance of horse abuse.
- b. **Conduct Violations:** Unsportsmanlike or disrespectful behavior toward officials, staff, volunteers, or other participants. This standard applies to the PR as well as their entourage (including family, coaches, grooms, owners, or support staff).
- c. **Safety:** Failing to follow sport-specific regulations or safety requirements, such as mandatory headgear rules.
- d. **Ethical Standards:** Any actions that contradict the FEI Code of Ethics.

9. STABLING / CAMP

- a. **The Camp** will open 13th May and close on 18th May 2026. All stable requests must be submitted before 10th May 2026 along with the relevant stable fees.
- b. **Stable fee:** Stable fee will be ₹2,000/- per stable per day for permanent stables and ₹1,000/- per stable per day for temporary stables, depending on availability. Stable bookings will be confirmed only after receiving the full charges for the intended number of days.
- c. **Self-Containment:** All teams must be self-contained, i.e., they should bring their own rations, grass, straw, fodder, equipment for camping, transport, etc. and make their own arrangements for staff stay and food.



10. MEDICAL & VETERINARY

First aid facilities will be available at the venue. A Veterinary Officer will be available on-call throughout the competition. Emergency medical services for riders will be on standby. The organisers will not be responsible for any medical or veterinary expenditure incurred.

Infectious Disease Documentation

Upon arrival at HPRC, all horses must be accompanied by valid negative test results for Equine Infectious Anemia (Coggins) and Glanders (utilizing CFT or Mallein methods). To be accepted into the camp, these certificates must have a validity of a minimum of 15 days prior to arrival. Please be advised that entry to the premises will be strictly denied for any horse lacking the required documentation.

11. GENERAL INFORMATION

Liability and Indemnification

The Organizing Committee, along with its staff, agents, and officials, assumes no responsibility for any accident, injury, or illness affecting horses, riders, or support personnel at the event. By entering, participants agree to indemnify the Organizers against any claims or damages resulting from such occurrences. Furthermore, the Committee is not responsible for the loss or theft of personal property. Any medical or veterinary first aid administered on-site is provided without liability to the Committee or the attending professionals.

Insurance: While the Organizing Committee assumes no liability for the health or safety of participants and their animals, exhibitors are encouraged to secure private insurance. We strongly advise participating clubs and units to obtain comprehensive policies—at their own expense—covering riders, staff, and horses. This coverage should ideally span the duration of the competition as well as transit to and from HPRC. The Committee will not be held responsible for any illness or injury occurring to horses or team members.

Hospitality: Refreshments will be available for purchase at the Club for participants and spectators.

Parking: Parking is available within the HPRC campus. All vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.

Departure Clearance Procedures

Prior to leaving the facility, all horse owners and riders must secure a clearance certificate from the Organizing Committee. These certificates are issued during standard business hours, provided all outstanding accounts have been settled in full. The Camp-In-Charge is instructed to permit the departure of horses and personnel only upon presentation of this official clearance.
